## EXECUTIVE PROFILE

Maribeth “Bunny” B. de Montaigne is a Filipina community-development and government-relations leader and co-founder of the Global Green Power group, with more than two decades leading the community, social-licence and government-liaison pillar of a major Philippine renewable-energy platform. As President & Director of Socio-Economic Development at Biomass Asia Inc., she leads host-community engagement, government relations and biomass supply-chain partnerships for the biochar and carbon-removal platform.

She co-founded and served as President of Global Green Power, where she led the regulatory campaign that secured all forty-six government permits and licences for the biomass power platform, and built the feedstock base directly with farming communities, irrigators’ associations, rice mills and sugarcane consortiums — securing 25-year biomass supply contracts totalling 3.5 million tonnes across Luzon, the Visayas (including Panay/Iloilo) and Mindanao. She authored the company’s Code of Business Ethics, designed the Biomass Fair Pricing scheme and created the SHARE community-benefit programme.

She maintains direct working relationships with the Philippine Congress, Senate and Office of the President, and led a national policy programme to reclassify biomass as a freely-traded commodity. This community-embedded delivery and government-liaison capability — the social licence underpinning the platform’s bankability — is her core contribution to Biomass Asia.
